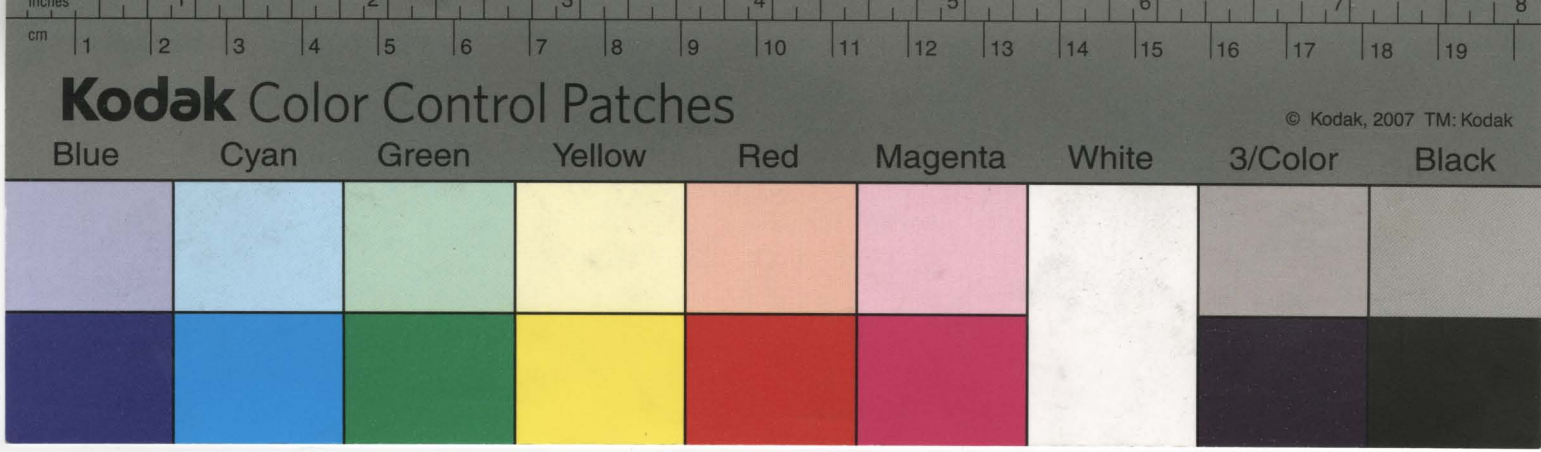
I lately had some Conference w<sup>th</sup> Doctor Petty about

 whereas they are now set forth: but since this I am informed by my wife that

 that may prejudice you I leave you to judge: but howeever the lands  
 should have been by Doctor Petty's owne confession) arrable meadow &  
 pasture as you see has not been observed in yo: case, and therefore you  
 ought as hee says to be supplied w<sup>th</sup> more lands added to them to make  
 them in some measure Equivallent to those y<sup>e</sup> are better: what yo:  
 resolves are herein I know not but certainly it were worth a country  
 by their either to get better land or to have yo: supplied like Cap: Leigh;  
 I have not as yet heard from you concerning those lands in the County  
 of Wicklow given by parliament to you & others y<sup>e</sup> received leases at sundry  
 if I may have their letter of attorney to prosecute in their behalfe I  
 will doe my best for them but then I much expect their directions and  
 such orders or ordinances y<sup>e</sup> acts as are materiall to the business, &  
 what they will demand for them in case I doe recover them; but what  
 I must let you know I doe not thinke there are 10000 acres of land  
 arrable meadow pasture y<sup>e</sup> is forfeited in any County, and you know  
 y<sup>e</sup> County w<sup>ch</sup> others is allotted for soldiers arrears before 99. my service  
 & my wifes presented to yo: la: I rest yo: assured loving kineman  
 MEASH.
